

1. **The Chapel** (Administration Building) designed by Andrew Jackson Downing, the preeminent designer of Landscape Architecture of his time.

1A. **Rockaway Footpath Monument**

2. **Edward Copeland** (47 Mt. Lebanon) Single term mayor of Brooklyn, first Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

3. **Strod Putnam** (Falling Leaf) A fourteen year old who enlisted in 1864, he was the youngest enlisted soldier in the Civil War.

4. **Antonio "Tony" Pastor** (Shadowy Way) The Father of Vaudeville.

5. **Carlo Cappa** (188 Shadowy Way) Popular Band Leader of *The Regiment Band*.

6. **Seamen's Monument** (Seamans Grounds) final resting place for indigent sailors who died in New York Harbor.

7. **William Howard** (1 Beacon Hill) forced by the British to lead them around the Jamaica Pass by way of the Rockaway Footpath in August 1776.

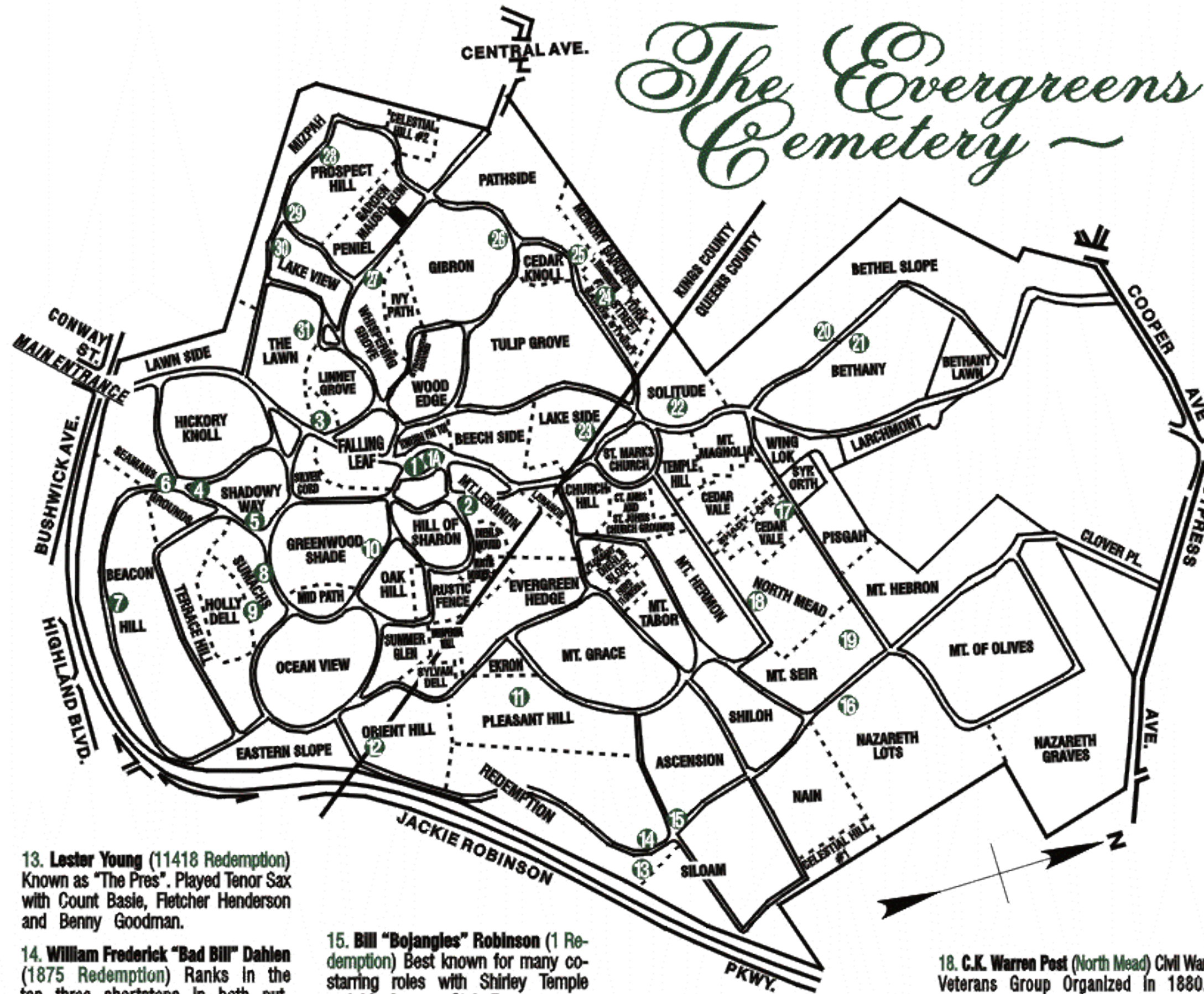
8. **Brooklyn Eastern District Fire Department** (Summacks) land sold to The Williamsburg Fire Department in 1852 for One Dollar. First burial in 1854.

9. **Anthony Comstock** (95 Summacks) Founder of the Society For Suppression Of Vice. Father of the so called Comstock Laws of 1873.

10. **Emma Thursby** (129 Greenwood Shade) Nicknamed "The American Nightingale".

11. **Thomas Wiggins** (Plot D Pleasant Hill) Known as "Blind Tom". Blind and autistic, he composed and performed music.

12. **George William Hall** (105 Orient Hill) Center fielder and celebrated home run hitter. Played with the Boston Red Stockings, 1874 and the Philadelphia Athletics, 1875. Banned from baseball for throwing Playoff Games.



13. **Lester Young** (11418 Redemption) Known as "The Pres". Played Tenor Sax with Count Basie, Fletcher Henderson and Benny Goodman.

14. **William Frederick "Bad Bill" Dahlen** (1875 Redemption) Ranks in the top three shortstops in both put-outs and assists. Committed 975 errors, a record. Managed "The Brooklyn Dodgers".

15. **Bill "Bojangles" Robinson** (1 Redemption) Best known for many co-starring roles with Shirley Temple and his famous Stair Dance.

16. **Silvie Hein** (1118 Nazareth) Co-Founder of ASCAP.

17. **20th Regiment U.S. Colored Troops** (Cedar Vale) Formed on Riker's Island. Saw duty in Texas, Florida, Tennessee and New Orleans.

18. **C.K. Warren Post** (North Mead) Civil War Veterans Group Organized in 1880.

19. **Pat Rooney** (826/859 Mt. Seir) Softshoe dancer known for his theme song "Daughter of Rosie O'Grady".

20. **William Steinitz** (5896 Bethel Slope) First American "World Chess Champion".

21. **Henrietta A. Halsey** (122 Bethany) Founder of the "Daughters Of The 17th Century", organized in Brooklyn in 1896.

22. **Phineas L. Slayton** (66 Solitude) "The Great Inventor". His inventions include the fountain pen, shoe pegging machine, and the Singer sewing machine.

23. **John Bunny** (407 Lakeside) The first comic star of The American Screen.

24. **Francis Guy** (Sandstreet Grounds) One of America's first Landscape Painters, *Brooklyn Snowscape* completed in 1820 is his most famous work.

25. **Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire Monument** (Brooklyn City Grounds) A monument dedicated to 16 unidentified victims of the fire, March 26, 1911.

26. **William Edward Hickey** (N67 GIBRON) Brooklyn born actor best known for his Oscar nominated role in the 1985 film "Prizzi's Honor".

27. **Jonathan and Mary Reed** (Whispering Grove) Mr. Reed spent 12 years living inside Mary's tomb, only going home at night to sleep. He filled the tomb with his wife's favorite items including her pet canary.

28. **Actor Fund Monument** (1-8 Prospect Hill) Dedicated June 16, 1887. The Fund was organized to help actors who had fallen on hard times.

29. **John T. Raymond** (10 Prospect Hill) Actor who starred in "Gilded Cage", written by Mark Twain.

30. **ELKS Rest** (Lakeview) First ELKS Rest in the U.S.A. Plot purchased in 1878 as the final resting place of many of the first Herd of ELKS.

31. **Winsor McCay** (64 The Lawn) Popular cartoonist and cartoon animator.
